#### Democratic Candidates

##### JOSEPH R. BIDEN JR.

Candidacy Withdrawn.

##### HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON

WEB SITE: hillaryclinton.com

BIOGRAPHY: Hillary Rodham Clinton, 60, graduated from Wellesley College in 1969 and Yale Law School in 1973. She was the First Lady of Arkansas from 1979 to 1981 and the First Lady of the United States from 1993 to 2001. She has represented New York in the U.S. Senate since 2000.

FOSSIL FUELS: Hillary's plan to move our country toward energy independence has three big goals: to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 80 percent from 1990 levels by 2050; to cut foreign oil imports by two-thirds from projected levels by 2030; and to transform our carbon-based economy into an efficient green economy.

IRAQ AND THE MIDDLE EAST: Hillary will end the war in Iraq. She will replace our troops with a new diplomatic initiative to restore stability to Iraq and the region. She will ensure that America plays a constructive and engaged role in a renewed Middle East peace process.

HEALTH COVERAGE: Hillary has a plan to ensure quality, affordable health care for all Americans. Under her plan, individuals will get a tax credit to help pay for premiums; insurance companies won't be able to discriminate based on pre-existing conditions; and people won't lose coverage if they switch or lose their jobs.

CAMPAIGN SPENDING LIMITS: Hillary will work to move our country to a public financing system that is both fair and effective.

It is the only real solution to reducing the influence of money in politics, and she will help pass and sign into law a meaningful, fair, and comprehensive public financing system. IMMIGRATION: Hillary supports comprehensive immigration reform that includes strengthening our borders; placing stronger sanctions on employers; supporting family reunification; and providing a path to earned legalization for people who have been living in the United States respecting the law, learning English and willing to meet a high bar.

##### JOHN EDWARDS

WEB SITE: johnedwards.com

BIOGRAPHY: John Edwards has spent a lifetime taking on special interests and fighting for regular Americans – in courtrooms, in the Senate and beyond. He fought for health care, strengthening the middle class, better schools, preserving the environment and reforming campaign finance. Recently, he directed a poverty center at UNC Chapel Hill.

FOSSIL FUELS: I will cap carbon emissions and reduce them by 80 percent by 2050 and I will create a new fund, financed by greenhouse gas polluters, to invest in clean energy technology. And I will ask Americans – who are ready to be patriotic about something other than war

– to conserve.

IRAQ AND THE MIDDLE EAST: We should immediately draw down 40,000 to 50,000 troops, completely withdraw all combat troops in Iraq within nine to ten months and leave no permanent bases behind. After withdrawal, we should retain sufficient forces in friendly nearby countries to ensure that instability in Iraq doesn't spill over into other countries.

HEALTH COVERAGE: I was the first candidate to propose a detailed plan guaranteeing true universal health care. I will pass a law mandating that every American have insurance, require businesses to cover their employees or help pay for their coverage and make insurance affordable by expanding public programs and offering tax credits.

CAMPAIGN SPENDING LIMITS: To reduce the influence of money in politics, I will create a public financing system for congressional candidates and strengthen the current system for presidential candidates. I will rewrite rules to put small donors in charge through increased matching funds. I will reduce contribution limits to better reflect Americans' incomes.

IMMIGRATION: Immigration is central to the story of America, but today our system needs an overhaul. We need to get control of our borders, create a fair path to citizenship that requires paying a fine and learning English, and crack down on employers that violate the law.

##### BARACK OBAMA

WEB SITE: barackobama.com

BIOGRAPHY: Obama began his career as a community organizer on Chicago's South Side and headed a voter registration drive. Obama practiced civil rights law and taught constitutional law. He served eight years in the State Senate before his election to the U.S. Senate. He graduated from Columbia University and Harvard Law.

FOSSIL FUELS: Obama supports a bold market-based cap-and-trade system to reduce dependence on foreign oil and combat climate change. Obama will also dramatically increase investment in clean energy technologies and energy efficiency. He proposes increasing fuel efficiency standards, biofuels, electricity from renewable sources, and a low carbon fuel standard.

IRAQ AND THE MIDDLE EAST: Obama opposed the war in Iraq from the beginning. He will end it by withdrawing our combat troops over 16 months, calling a new constitutional convention, and urging Iraq's neighbors to work towards stability. Obama seeks a twostate solution—Israel and Palestine living side by side in peace and security.

HEALTH COVERAGE: Obama will sign universal health legislation by the end of his first term, ensuring all Americans have high-quality, affordable coverage. His plan will save a typical American family up to \$2,500 annually; modernize our health care system to

The League of Women Voters does not support or oppose any candidate or political party.

#### GROUND RULES

1. All qualified presidential candidates were invited to provide biographical information and responses to five issue specific questions. Candidates were qualified if they met the following criteria: 1) the candidate must have made a public announcement of her/his intention to run for her/his Party's nomination for President; and 2) the candidate must have met the Presidential Election Campaign Fund Act's minimum contribution threshold requirements for qualifying for matching funds, based on the most recent data publicly available on the FEC Web site as of October 5, 2007.

2. Responses were limited to 50 words and truncated after the 50th word.

3. If a candidate did not respond by the deadline, "No Response Received" is printed.

#### ABOUT THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT

**Salary:** \$400,000 per year **Term:** Four years. Limit of two terms.

**How Elected:** Every four years political parties nominate candidates to run for President of the United States in a General Election that is held on the first Tuesday in November of years divisible by the number four. Although all parties use conventions to nominate their candidates, in most states the Democratic and Republican parties also run state-wide caucuses or primary elections. The results of the primary influence how the delegates to their respective party's convention will cast ballots for candidates for President. The degree to which convention delegates are bound by the results of the primary elections or caucuses varies from state to state.

**Duties:** The President is the head of state of the United States of America and is the Chief Executive Officer and the Commander in Chief of all military forces. The powers of the President are described in the Constitution and federal law. Subject to Senate approval, the President appoints the members of the Cabinet, ambassadors to other nations and the United Nations, Supreme Court Justices and federal judges. The President, along with the Cabinet and its agencies, is responsible for carrying out and enforcing the laws of the United States.

The President may also recommend legislation to the United States Congress.

CAMPAIGN SPENDING LIMITS: Obama strongly supports public financing of elections and does not accept any campaign donations from federal lobbyists or PACs. Obama has co-sponsored legislation that would create a voluntary system to provide full public funding for candidates who agree to spending limits.

IMMIGRATION: Obama supports comprehensive immigration reform that strengthens border security; fixes our broken immigration bureaucracy; and creates a responsible path to citizenship that requires undocumented immigrants to pay a fine, learn English, follow the law, and go to the back of the line.

I support a comprehensive reform strategy that strongly enforces our borders, punishes businesses that hire outside the law, and affords a fair and structured path to citizenship for those who abide by the rules.

**U.S. MILITARY:** The men and women serving in our military are among our bravest and brightest citizens. The US military should be used strategically and only in cases where we are defending our country's vital interests. It should not be the military's responsibility to engage in nation building.

**FEDERAL DEFICIT:** The first step is defining a new strategy in Iraq that allows us to redirect our spending toward national priorities such as paying down the deficit. Another source would be rolling back tax cuts for the wealthiest Americans, ending preferential tax treatment of hedge funds and closing corporate tax loopholes.

**THOMAS E. "PINKSTON" HARRIS (R)**

**CHRISTOPHER PANASUK (R)**  
**BIOGRAPHY:** Christopher Panasuk is not your ordinary congressional candidate. Born January 28th 1975 to John and Rachel Panasuk in Baltimore, Maryland, Mr. Panasuk's life has been anything but idyllic. Falling in with a bad crowd in his early teen aged years, he learned just how cruel the world can be. He became addicted to an assortment of drugs, and was homeless off and on until 1994 when he learned the value of true friendship...  
**IMMIGRATION:** First, deploy the National guard and the Army Corps of Engineers to secure the borders. Second, end birthright citizenship. Third, reform current immigration laws to manage the people already here. Fourth reform the process to enter legally, therefore discouraging illegal immigration. Remove, without fail, illegal convicted felons.  
**U.S. MILITARY:** The primary function for the US Military is to defend the US. The secondary role is to defend of our allies. While overseas bases are necessary for logistic and strategic reasons, the sheer numbers need to be reevaluated. Many overseas bases were established following WWII. Are they really still needed?  
**FEDERAL DEFICIT:** Cut unnecessary spending. This is a very simple answer to a very large question, but at the root, this is what must be done.

**HEALTH CARE:** The Federal government does not have a Constitutional right to provide health care for anyone. If Federally provided health care is what people want, a Constitutional Amendment must be put through and must stand up to ratification by the people. States can and should be encouraged to provide catastrophic insurance.

**ENVIRONMENTAL INTEGRITY:** Encouraging telecommuting would both serve the bottom line of businesses and the needs of the planet. Gallup Polls indicated the national average commute is 45 minutes. Millions of people could be taken off the roads to do their daily jobs. Companies save money on offices and fuel emissions would dive.

**CIVIL RIGHTS & NATIONAL SECURITY:** The Constitution outlines both individual liberties and governmental limitations. People lose liberties in this country through the massive amount and complexity of our laws. Congress was given 1 day to vote on the 342 page Patriot Act. Many admit they never even read it. This travesty must be addressed.

**PAUL SPAUSE (R)**  
**BIOGRAPHY:** As a high school and college student I learned about our history, government and constitution. As an officer in the U.S. Air Force I learned how to solve difficult problems and developed the ability to boldly lead men and women to that end. I can make a positive difference.

**IMMIGRATION:** The attractive nuisance of a porous border promotes human smuggling, resulting in people dying. The borders must be sealed. I also support: an immediate change to rules that restrict those here illegally from reentering for five years; and a smart policy for youths here illegally who are culturally Americans.

**U.S. MILITARY:** The primary purpose of the U.S. military is to protect our citizens and the integrity of our nation from foreign and domestic enemies. The people of the United States also have a vital interest in thwarting repressive totalitarian regimes throughout the world. Military action is the last option of diplomacy.

**FEDERAL DEFICIT:** I would eliminate ineffective expenditures, overhaul the federal revenue system to promote national economic expansion and job creation, and promote federal programs that encourage active, informed consumer choices. My solution is, in one word, Reaganomics. Government and taxes should not be the focus of an economy.

**HEALTH CARE:** Health care in our nation must return to a patient-driven, patient-centric system. Government promoted the centralization of health care through employers as a consequence of wage controls, and has caused our current troubles. A strong economy, good jobs, and informed consumers will resolve the

nations healthcare needs.  
**ENVIRONMENTAL INTEGRITY:** The interests of individuals and business are not necessarily different. The governments should set stable, realistic environmental standards, promote technical solutions to remedy problems, and actively, scientifically monitor the integrity of the environment. Government should take legal action against law breakers and work to remedy problems of the past.  
**CIVIL RIGHTS & NATIONAL SECURITY:** Individual liberties and national security are not necessarily at odds. 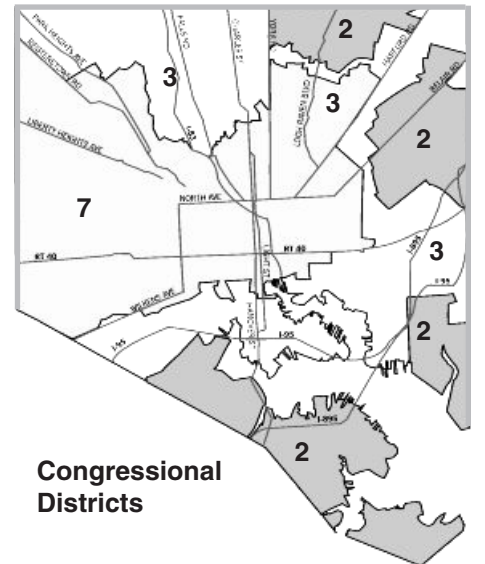
